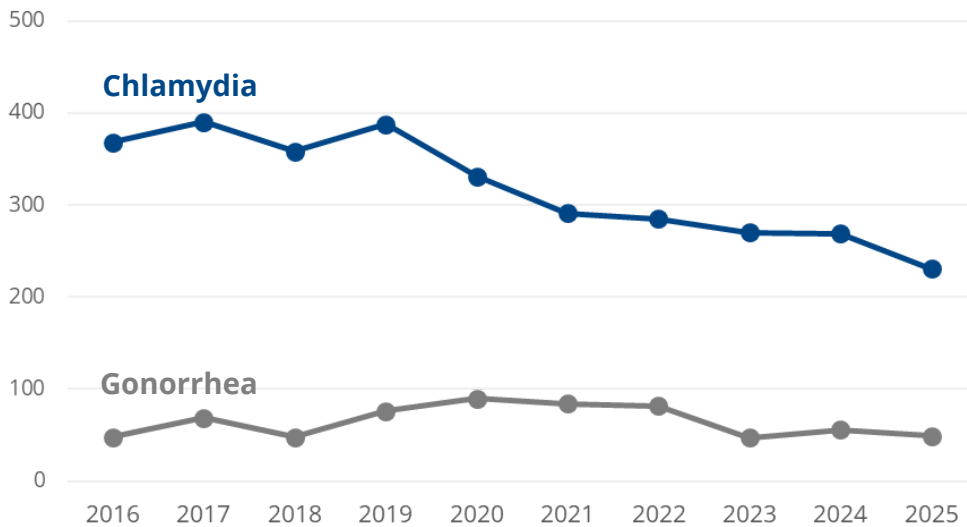


200+ chlamydia cases occurred each year in Medina County.

Number of Medina County Chlamydia and Gonorrhea Cases by Year, 2016-2025



While there was an overall decrease in reported chlamydia cases from 2016 to 2025, more than 200 reported chlamydia cases occurred each year among Medina County residents. Gonorrhea cases ranged from 90 cases in 2020 to a low of 48 cases in both 2016 and 2018.

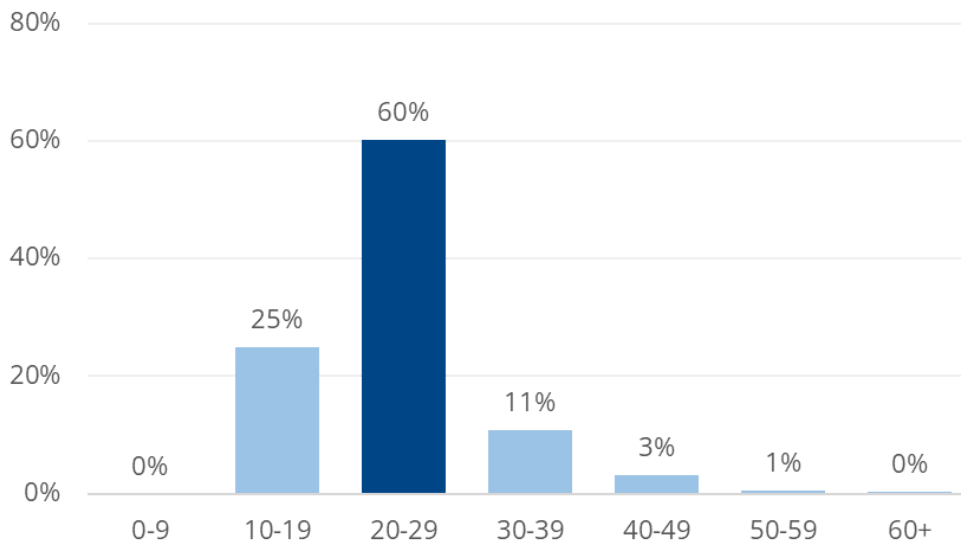
Fast Fact:

Chlamydia is the highest reported sexually transmitted infection (STI) across the United States. Symptoms include burning sensation while peeing, abnormal vaginal discharge, or discharge from penis. However, it is common for individuals with chlamydia infection to have no symptoms.



The age group 20 to 29 years had the highest percentage of chlamydia cases.

Percent of Medina County Chlamydia Cases by Age Group, 2016 - 2025



The age group 20-29 years accounted for 60% of chlamydia cases among Medina County residents from 2016-2025. The age group with the second highest number of reported cases was 10-19 years (25%). Individuals 30 years or older made up 15% of cases.

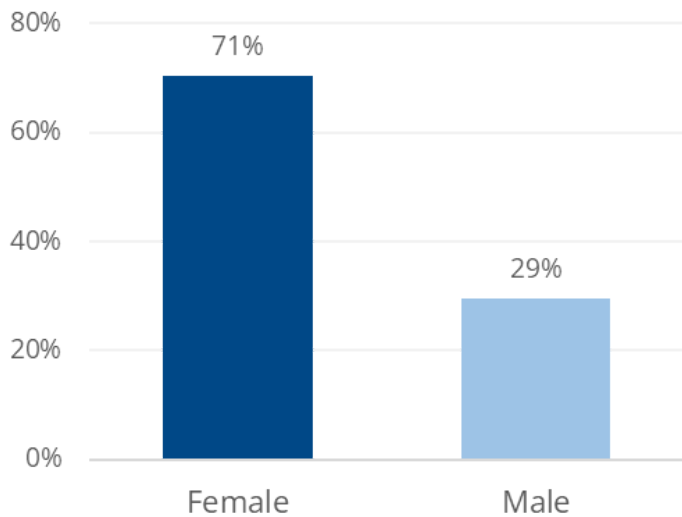
Fast Fact:

Chlamydia spreads through vaginal, anal, or oral sex with an infected partner. A partner that does not have symptoms can still spread the infection. You can prevent chlamydia by using condoms and other barriers correctly every time.



Females were diagnosed with chlamydia more often than males.

2016 - 2025



More chlamydia cases were reported in females (71%) than males (30%) from 2016 to 2025 among Medina County residents. Although more cases are reported in females, **chlamydia can infect anyone regardless of gender or sex.**

Fast Fact:

It is important to receive treatment if you test positive for chlamydia as it can cause serious health problems and you may transmit the infection to others.

Data Sources

Ohio Disease Reporting System (ODRS). ODRS was used to calculate the number of reportable cases of chlamydia and gonorrhea among Medina County residents. Chlamydia and gonorrhea are reportable diseases by Ohio Administrative Code 3701-3. The Medina County Health Department monitors trends in all reportable diseases.
