

This data brief provides a data summary for emergency room (ER) visits related to drug overdoses or interactions during Quarter 2 of 2018. The data is broken down into sections by drugs (overall), opioids, and heroin for 2018 and are compared to 2017 visits for the same classifiers. This data was extracted from an Ohio Department of Health maintained surveillance system called EpiCenter that tracks chief complaints for ER visits in Medina County.

Figure 1 displays the number of drug (overall) related ER visits for quarter 2. May had the highest number of drug related ER visits with 45(37.8%). Quarter 2 2018 had a -29.2% decrease in the number of drug related ER visits compared to quarter 2 2017.

Figure 2: Opioid and Heroin Related ER Visits by Month (Medina County, 2018)

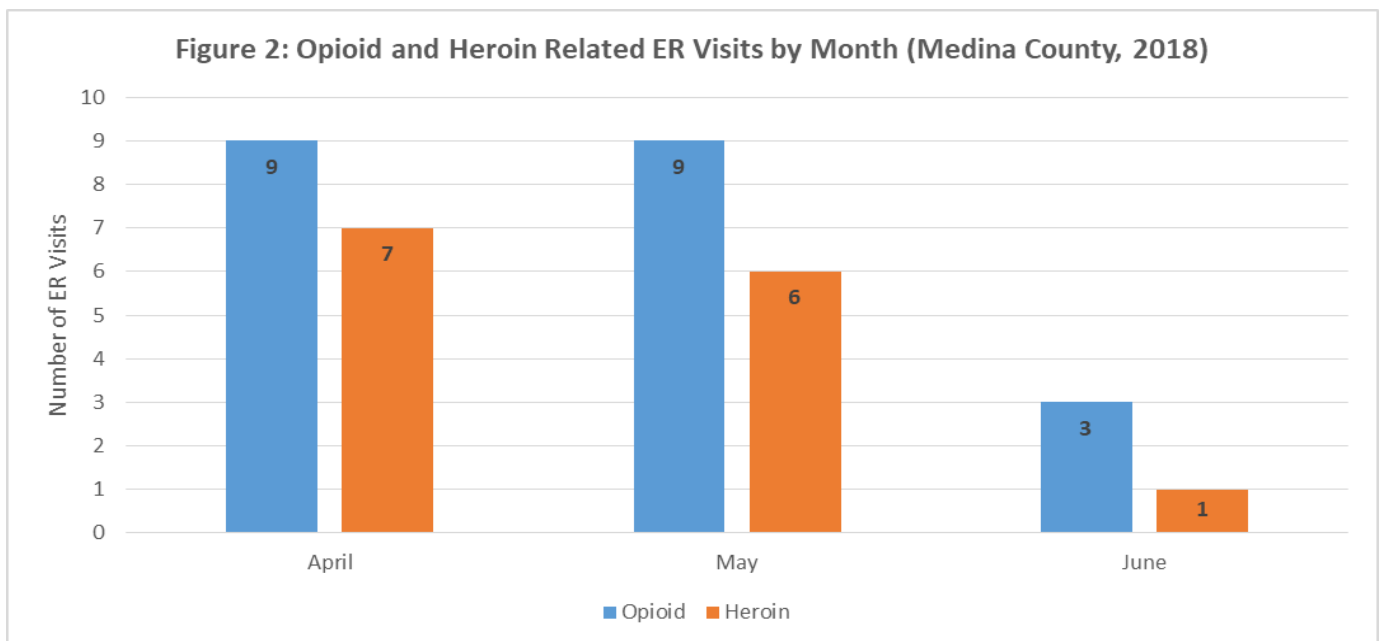


Figure 2 displays the number of opioid and heroin related ER visits for quarter 2. April had the highest number of heroin related ER visits with 7 (50.0%). April and May each had the highest number of opioid related ER visits with 9 (42.9%). Quarter 2 2018 had a -68.9% decrease in the number of heroin related ER visits compared to quarter 2 2017. ***Note: The reasons for visit are largely limited to "Overdose" or "Interaction". Details related to the reason(s) for the ER visits are generally unavailable.***
